JANUARY 2019 MEETING IS "BUILD YOUR RDF ANTENNA"

Amazingly, 2019 is here. My, how fun flies when you're doing time.

One of the activities that the club has been contemplating for years is Fox Hunting. What is Fox Hunting you say? It is essentially, Amateur Radio Direction Finding. A transmitter, which transmits a specific signal at a regular interval, is hidden somewhere in town, and licensed operators try to find it, using their Amateur Radio knowledge and equipment.

This spring, we will be hosting our first SCARA Fox Hunt. In order to prepare, we need to provide an opportunity to learn about Fox Hunting and to build a basic antenna to allow you to participate. At our January meeting, we'll be building Tape Measure Yagi Antennas that we can use for the SCARA Fox Hunt. An Instruction Sheet and Shopping list are enclosed with this email, giving you plenty of time to do some shopping for the meeting. We'll have cutting and soldering equipment available at the meeting to help with assembly.

Your next question is probably, "Why is this useful?"

First, when building your shack, you may need to locate a nuisance interference with your equipment or find out if your equipment is the interference your neighbor is complaining about. If you can "sniff out" a signal's source, you can do something about it

Next, Fox Hunting will provide an opportunity to better understand signal propagation and limitations. What better way to understand how others can or cannot hear your call by experiencing the RX end of transmission from various elevations and terrain.

Further, these events also provide you opportunities to do a homebrew project or two or three.

Finally, it's fun!

If you would like to learn more about Fox Hunting, there are many sites on the web, which you can research extensively. One of the better sites is http://homingin.com.

So, get your kit of materials put together and bring them to the January 2019 Meeting. We'll be learning about Fox Hunting and building the Tape Measure Yagi so that you'll be equipped for the Fox Hunt this coming spring. Don't worry about tools—the club will have tools necessary at the meeting. You just need to bring the items from the Shopping List in the enclosed how-to. If you decide to build your antenna early, that's OK too; just bring it to the meeting to show it off. =)

(Note: Bill says he will have appropriate connectors to match your HT to the RG58, so just bring the RG58 if you don't already have the right connector.)

Shopping List

- 1 Inexpensive, 10- or 12-ft Metal Tape Measure
- 1 5-in Piece of Solid Wire (any gauge, 14 or smaller works best)
- 3 RG58 Feed Line, Feet (with connector at one end to fit your Handheld Radio)
- 6 Stainless Steel Hose Clamps, 1 ½-in diameter
- 2 Sched 40 PVC Pipe, ½-in, Feet (cut 1 piece 7 inches; cut 1 piece 11 ½ inches)
- 1 Sched 40 PVC T, 1/2-in
- 2 Sched 40 PVC X, 1/2-in

Come to the January meeting and build one of these.



Using FT8? Then It's Time to Uprade to Version 2.0.0 of WSJT-X

The **FT8 and MSK144 protocols** have been enhanced in a way that is not backward compatible with older program versions. The new protocols became the world-wide standards starting on December 10, 2018, and *all users should upgrade to WSJT-X 2.0 by January 1, 2019.* After that date, only the new FT8 and MSK144 should be used on the air.

Upgrading from a previous WSJT-X version will be seamless. There is no need to uninstall a previous version or move any files. Download the current version at:

Pete went on to confirm activations with 4 additional sites!

Encouraged by the "Parks On The Air" events of the past few years, the small but dedicated group of hams in the Halifax, Nova Scotia area have initiated the "Canadian National Parks On The Air" contest. Supported by the Radio Amateurs of Canada (RAC) and Parks Canada, they invite hams to operate at the Canadian National Parks and Historic Sites and Parks.


The CNPOTA event is open to all licensed Amateur Radio operators worldwide.

FREE STUFF!

If you have never been to the *Internet Archive*, you owe it to yourself to check it out. It's a non-profit library of millions of free books, movies, software, music, websites, and more. If you search on "Amateur Radio", you will find over 5,000 items listed including books, magazines, audio and video recordings. It includes nearly every issue of "73 Magazine" (its title changed over the years) from 1960 to 2003. The issues were scanned and can be read online or downloaded in several formats including PDF which nearly every modern





device can display. You will probably want to skip the other file format as they used an optical character reader (OCR) to convert the articles to a text format and the result can be difficult to follow. Fair warning, if you are thinking about downloading all of the 73 Magazines, that's probably around 16 gigabytes of data.

There is some recient material and a lot of historical stuff. I found a friend's call sign in the 1952 listing of call signs. And it's all free for the downloading.
