

May 2019 - 13 Straight Days of Tornadoes


If it seemed like the evening news included tornado reports every evening for a couple of straight weeks in May, you aren't wrong. For 13 straight days in May, weather officials logged at least eight tornado reports per day across the U.S.

The streak reached 11 days on May 27, Monday night, when a flurry of tornadoes ripped through Indiana and Ohio, including an EF4 twister that struck Dayton, Ohio, causing significant damage to local communities including damage to the Hara Arena where Hamvention was held for many years. The next night, a destructive tornado, also an EF4, ripped through Linwood, Kansas.

On May 29, the U.S. had its 13th straight day with at least eight tornadoes, which broke the previous record of 11 days straight set in 1980. On the day when the record was broken, the U.S. had an average of 27.5 tornadoes per day during the outbreak. Only three days during this period did not see an EF3 tornado or stronger. An additional two tornadoes were also reported on May 30, after the streak officially ended. The final tornado total for the May outbreak was 271, with 48 strong tornadoes and 2 violent tornadoes.

The record for the most U.S. tornadoes in any given month is May 2015, at 414 tornadoes. Preliminary reports for all of May 2019, including tornadoes not included in this outbreak, list 505 tornadoes.

The May storms also included frequent heavy rainfall. This resulted in widespread flooding and flash flooding, which frequently interfered with emergency efforts relating to tornado damage. The new precipitation also extended existing flooding along the Mississippi River system to record durations.
